Martin Luther King, Jr. Was a black pastor. He was the leader of the civil rights movement demanding equality for black people, Many southern states in the USA, were segregated in the 1950 s: Black children couldn't go to the same school as whites; Blacks and whites couldn't sit in the same seats, theatres.....

In December 1955, Rosa Parks, a black woman, was on the bus in Montgomery, Alabama. A white man demanded her seat and she refused. She was arrested. King, who was working in Montgomery, led a black protest. For a year black people refused to use the buses. Finally, segregation on the buses was declared illegal.

King's speeches were famous and convinced many people, including President Kennedy that he was right. Like Ghandi, Dr King refused violence. On April 4th, he was assassinated.
