This report presents the findings of a large-scale British survey done on 1491 people in order to build up a public opinion about climate change by discussing its causes, its consequences and the different possibilities of preventing it.

When asked if they thought the world climate was changing, 99% of the informants said they did. The informants then were asked what might cause this change. 68% of them said air pollution and carbon dioxide .19% of them thought the burning of fossil fuels and transport (including cars and planes) were the cause. 10% believed that industrial emissions and the loss of the ozone layer were the reason. 2% said deforestation while only 1% of the informants considered nuclear power as cause of climate change.

When asked about the consequences, the majority of the informants said that <u>they</u> were very dangerous because they were predicted to intensify in the coming decades. They thought that these effects include a rise in the Temperatures, a shift of the rainfall, and an increase of the sea levels. But according to them, the most dangerous effect is the high number of natural disasters happening suddenly, such as floods and droughts.

Coming to the possible solutions, 70 % of the informants agreed that renewable sources of electricity (such as wind and solar) can help prevent climate change. 20 % of them found that the solution was the promotion of more oxygen. And only 10 % of them thought that Climate change was a very natural event and it happened whether man was there or not.
