Text : Solidarity In Natural Disasters

During the past decade there has been a considerable increase in the number of natural disasters which have caused hardship and suffering in many countries. Disasters are not confined to particular regions, nor do they discriminate between developing and developed countries. For the past year alone, widespread floods in France, hangar, Italy, Switzerland, Algeria and Vietnam as well as devastating earthquakes in El Salvador and India have reminded us of the need to take global preventive measures against disasters.

During the 1990s, there was a ten per cent annual increase in economic loss due to disaster ... global warming is expected to increase the incidence of disasters such as storms, droughts and floods.

Although we continue to refer to these disasters as "natural", they are, to a large extent, man-made. Population growth , together with population movement and displacements to hazard prone areas ; the uncontrolled growth of megacities, the increasing emission of carbon dioxide and other green house gases ; deforestation and desertification ; erosion of agricultural land through poor irrigation practices ; the destruction of rangelands through overgrazing are all human factors which play a key role in the increase of natural disasters . Perhaps the most significant lesson we have learnt from the recurrence of disasters is that solidarity, close coordination and long-term commitment are necessary to promote a culture of disaster prevention.
