"I have a dream" is a 17-minute public speech by Martin Luther King, Jr. delivered on August 28th, 1963, in which he called for racial equality and an end to discrimination. The speech was a defining moment of the American Civil Rights Movement.

Delivered to over 200,000 civil rights supporters, the speech was ranked the top American speech of the 20th century. Dr. King had the power and the ability to transform those steps on the Lincoln Memorial into a monumental area that will forever be recognized. By speaking the way he did, he educated, he inspired and he informed not just the people there, but people throughout America and unborn generations.

At the end of the speech, King departed from his prepared text for a partly improvised peroration on the theme of "I have a dream", possibly prompted by Mahalia Jackson's cry. "Tell them about the dream, Martin! « He had first delivered a speech incorporating some of the same sections in Detroit in June 1963, when he marched on Woodward Avenue with Walter Reuther and the Reverend C.L. Franklin, and had rehearsed other parts.
