In recent years there have been many changes to the curriculum and the way Swedish schools are organised, but the basic premise of free education for all remains. Education is compulsory for all children aged 6 to 16. Families can send t<u>heir</u> children to any school – state-run or independent – without having to pay fees. The law states that children have equal right to education regardless of gender, ethnic or political background, and economic status of their families.

Independent schools in Sweden receive government funding and must in return not charge any student fees; **they** are, however, allowed to accept private donations. The majority of the education budget is financed by local taxes, and approximately half of the municipal budget is spent on education. Sweden is one of the few countries that still provide a free lunch for pupils. Several checks are in place to ensure equal conditions for private and public schools throughout the country. Today about one in five Swedish upper secondary school (high school) students attends an independent school.

Students who pass exams in at least Swedish, English and mathematics at the age of 15/16 (the vast majority) go on to do three years in *gymnasium* – upper secondary school (high school) – while the **others** study educational programmes tailored to their needs.
