Education in the largest sense is any act or experience that has a formative effect on the mind, character or physical ability of an individual. In its technical sense, education is the process by which society deliberately transmits *its* accumulated knowledge, skills and values from one generation to another.

Teachers in educational institutions direct the education of students and might draw on many subjects including reading, writing, mathematics, science and history. This process is sometimes called schooling when referring to the education of teaching only a certain subject, usually as professors at institutions of higher learning. There is also education in fields for those who want specific vocational skills, such as those required to be a pilot. In addition there an array of education possible at the informal level such as in museums and libraries, with the internet and in life experience. Many non- traditional education options are now available and continue to evolve. One of the most substantial uses in education is the use of technology. Classrooms of the 21st century contain interactive white boards, iPods, laptops etc. Teachers are encouraged to embed these *technological devices* in the curriculum in order to enhance students' learning and meet the needs of various types of learners.

A right to education has been created and organized by some jurisdictions: since 1952, article 2 of the first protocol to the European Convention on Human Rights obliges all signatory parties to guarantee the right to education. At work level, the United Nation' international Covenant on Economic, social and Cultural Rights of 1966 guarantees this right under its Article 13.
