## 4/ Chronological markers (Time sequencers)



First - then - after that - finally are chronological markers. They are used to organise a series of events.

### Example:

The cruise was wonderful! First, I sailed from Algiers to Tunis on a cruise ship. Then, I travelled by car to Cairo in Egypt. After that I went to Istanbul by plane to see Ahmed Sultan mosque. Finally, I returned to Algiers.

### 5/ Cause & Effect

1/ To express cause (reason), I use because / as / since Eg. Sarah did not go to school because she was sick. NOTE: We often use as and since at the beginning of the sentence. We use a comma (,) after the clause. 2/ To express effect (result), I use therefore / so Eg. Mark wanted to see Eiffel tower therefore he travelled to Paris.



## 2/ Pronunciation

#### 1/ Consonant Clusters

- A "consonant cluster" is a group of two or more successive "consonant sound" that are together and have no "vowel sound" between them. (Cambridge Dictionary)
- Consonant clusters in English my occur in "initial position" (beginning of the word) in "mid position" (in the middle of the word) or in "final position" (end of the word).

#### Examples:

initial position	mid position	final position
print/ brick,	Apricot/umbrella;	mint/ mend,
tree/ drive	dentist/active.	left/ fact

#### 2/ Dighthongs

A "diphthong" is a combination of two successive "vowel sounds": /e + 1/, /a + 1/, /3 + 1/, /3 + 0/, /a + 0/, /1 + 3/, /e + 3/, /0 + 3/.

There are eight diphthongs in English: /et/, /at/, /oɪ/, /oʊ/, /aʊ/, /tə/, /eə/, /ʊə/


