Part One: Reading.

(14 points)

Read the text carefully to do the following activities.

The Ancient Greeks were the first to create a democracy. The word "Democracy" comes from people (*demos*) and rule (*kratos*). It is the idea that the citizens take an active role in their government and manage it directly or through elected representatives. In addition, it supports the idea that the people can replace their government through peaceful transfer of power.

Athenian democracy developed around the 5th century B.C. The Greek idea of democracy was different from present-day democracy because all adult citizens were required to take an active part in the government. If they did not fulfill their duty, they would be fined and sometimes marked with red paint. Only free men were considered citizens in Athens. Women, children and slaves were not considered citizens and therefore could not vote.

Each year, 500 names were chosen from all of ancient Athens. They had to actively serve in the government for one year, during which they were responsible for making new laws, and controlled the political process. When a new law was proposed, all the citizens could vote on it. For that purpose, citizens had to attend the assembly on the day of the vote. This form of government is called direct democracy.
