He believed that health is based on appropriate diet and hygiene introduced the practice of confidentiality in" the oath of medicine which is still in use today.

‘‘Bangladesh’s banker to poor’’ wins Nobel Peace Prize

Muhammad Yunus was born in 1940 in Chittagong, Bangladesh. He is a Bangladeshi banker and economist. He is also the founder of Grameen Bank. Yunus is married to Afrozi Yunus, a professor of physics at Jhangirnagar University.

He went to primary school at his village school in Chittagong. Later, he studied at Chittagong Collegiate School where he passed the Matriculation exam in 1957

He completed his BA in 1960 and his MA in 1961. He got his Ph.D. in economics from Vanderbilt University in the United States in 1969. From 1969 to 1972, Yunus was an assistant professor of economics at Middle Tennessee State University before moving back to Bangladesh, where he joined Chittagong University as an economics professor.
